

What we do with your personal data?

The Irish League of Credit Unions (ILCU) and its affiliated credit unions (We/ Us/Our) collects your information and that relating to your parents or legal guardian for a number of reasons. This privacy notice describes how the credit union, Chapter and the ILCU collect and use personal information about you before and after the Credit Union Art Competition 2025.

The ILCU is the national organiser of the Credit Union Art Competition 2025. The ILCU is based at 77 Sir John Rogerson's Quay, Grand Canal Dock, Dublin, D02 F540. Please contact your local credit union or chapter directly for their address.

WHO LOOKS AFTER YOUR INFORMATION?

For the purposes of this competition, the credit union, Chapter and the ILCU are considered joint controllers, and this Privacy Notice reflects how data is managed by the joint controllers. The credit union is the primary data controller of the personal information you give us since they adjudicate stage 1 of the competition. Chapter will be considered a data controller for stage 2 (Regional level). The ILCU will be considered a data controller for the purposes of stage 3 (National level).

OUR USE OF YOUR INFORMATION

When you participate in the Credit Union Art Competition 2025 we may process your data in a variety of ways, for several different reasons and with a range of legal justifications based on contractual obligations, your consent and legitimate interest.

FULFILLING CONTRACT

We need certain data in order to enter you in the competition. As such, we process your data where the processing is necessary to:

- Fulfil the Credit Union Art Competition 2025 terms and conditions;
- Administer the competition;
- Deal with your enquiries and requests; and
- Contact the winners.

YOUR CONSENT

- We seek consent to use the photographic images of the winners, together with their name and ages, and that this data may be used in advertising and publicity. You can remove your consent for the processing of your image at any time before publication by emailing ilcuevents@creditunion.ie, however we will still need to publish your name and age if you are a winner (see below).

LEGITIMATE INTEREST

We require your name and age for advertising and publicity purposes. The legal basis for this is legitimate interest on the basis that we need to publicly identify winners for authenticity and transparency purposes.

WILL YOUR INFORMATION BE SHARED?

Winner's names, age and category will be displayed in the annual credit union calendar and other publicity campaigns (such as posters, cards and other point of sale materials). The calendar will be distributed to all ILCU affiliated credit unions for further distribution to credit union members.

Where you have given us permission to use your photographic image we may share those images along with names and age with national and local press as well as magazines, internal publications/web and social media (e.g. Facebook, Twitter and Instagram). Where appropriate we may disclose your personal data to third parties who may help us run and administer the Credit Union Art Competition 2025 such as printers, ad agencies and service providers.

We may also disclose personal data where we are legally obliged to disclose your information such as to our regulators or the police.

HOW AND WHY DO WE COLLECT AND USE YOUR INFORMATION?

We will only process your personal information for the purposes of the Credit Union Art Competition 2025. Your personal information will be collected following your completion of the entry form.

WHAT INFORMATION DO WE COLLECT?

We will collect, store, and use the following categories of personal information about you:

Your name, month and year of birth, age, address, health data (where you enter the additional needs category), school/college/club/organisation, and photograph.

DO YOU HAVE TO GIVE US YOUR INFORMATION?

You must give us some information to ensure you have complied with the terms and conditions of the Credit Union Art Competition 2025 and to administer the competition but there is some information that you can choose whether to let us have or not. When we ask you for information that you don't have to give us, we will ask for your permission and let you know why we want it and what we will do with it. If you don't want us to have the information in those cases, you won't have to.

HOW LONG WILL WE KEEP YOUR INFORMATION?

We don't keep it forever, only for as long as we need it to help us do the thing we needed it for. We will destroy your personal data in a safe manner within two years of the competition prize giving ceremony. Consents relating to photographic images will be retained for as long as the photographic image is being used.

GETTING IN TOUCH

If you're worried about how we get and use your information, you can speak to the credit union or the ILCU, who will be able to help you and answer any questions that you have. If you want to speak to somebody else, you can call the people who make sure that organisations like us are looking after your information correctly. Their contact details are set out below.

WHAT ARE YOUR RIGHTS

You and your parents have the right to:



Ask us to change information you think is wrong. You also have the right to ask us to complete information you think is incomplete.



You have the right to ask us for copies of your personal information. This right always applies. There are some exemptions, which means you may not always receive all the information we process.



In certain circumstances ask us to remove information when it's not needed anymore.



Object to processing of your personal data where we are relying on a legitimate interest and there is something about your particular situation which makes you want to object to processing on this ground.



Tell us you don't want your information to be processed. This applies only in certain circumstances



Where we are processing your data based solely on your consent you have a right to withdraw that consent at any time and free of charge



Request that we: a) provide you with a copy of any relevant personal data in a reusable format; or b) request that we transfer your relevant personal data to another controller where it's technically feasible to do so.

Please note that the above rights don't always apply and there may be some limitations.



ENTRY FORM RULES

1. The competition has two categories – General Category and Additional Needs Category – with the following age groups in each category:

 - ▶ 7 years and under
 - ▶ 8 – 10 years inclusive
 - ▶ 11 – 13 years inclusive
 - ▶ 14 – 17 years inclusive
 - ▶ Adult – 18 years and over

Ages as at 31st December 2025. Proof of date of birth may be requested by the credit union. There is a separate section for group entries in the Additional Needs Category only.

2. Entries to the Additional Needs Category are invited from children and adults with physical and intellectual disabilities. Group entrants must clearly tick the box under Additional Needs Category for them to submit a group entry. Entrants in this category are not required to use the theme.

3. The text of the theme does not have to be illustrated on your artwork. We are looking for your interpretation of the theme through your art.

4. All group entries will be judged together – no age categories apply.

5. Name, address, age, month and year of birth and other details (where applicable) must be clearly printed on the entry form and then attached to the back of the entry. Any entries bearing incomplete entry forms may not be considered.

6. All entry forms and artworks must be certified by teacher/facilitator/parent/guardian (under 18, General Category and Additional Needs Category), or by the entrant (over 18) as being an unaided and original work of the entrant.
7. All entries must be submitted in either **A3 (420mm wide x 297mm high) or A2 (594mm wide x 420mm high) and LANDSCAPE orientation. Other sizes and portrait oriented entries will be disqualified from adjudication.**

8. The entry can be drawn or painted in pencil, charcoal, pen or ink, felt-tip markers, crayon, pastel, water colours, gouache, acrylics, oils, poster colour or collage. Prints done from a lino block, wood block or any other method may also be submitted. No computer aided design (CAD) may be entered. No pieces of art under glass, as we cannot be responsible for same.

9. The competition is organised into three stages with the winner in each category being forwarded to the next stage, these being:

Stage 1	Credit Union Level
Stage 2	Chapter (Regional) Level
Stage 3	National Level

Entries must be submitted to your local participating credit union only – no entries will be accepted directly at regional or national level.

10. It should be noted that once artwork is received by us they become our property and may be reproduced at our discretion and may only be returned at our discretion. All entries are accepted as original works and we are not responsible for any breach of copyright. We will not accept liability for loss or damage to any work submitted.

11. Entrants may enter the competition only once in any given year.

12. We reserve the right not to award prizes in any category. The decision of the adjudicators is final and no correspondence will be entered into.
